WILKIE ON THE AIRWAVES Part I - BBC

Using BBC archives and its complete collection of *Radio Times* I have been piecing together a list of broadcasts of Wilkie Collins's works on BBC radio and television as well as programmes which discussed or involved him.

There have been a number of new discoveries, though sadly much of the broadcast material no longer exists. Just one out of seven episodes of the 1959 TV dramatisation of *The Moonstone* is found in the BBC TV archives and there seems to be no copy of any of the episodes of the 1966 production of *The Woman in White*. Copies of all the rest are in the BBC archives.

Many of the radio broadcasts were either never kept or have been destroyed. It is possible of course that they are preserved on recordings by members of the public. The oldest traced radio broadcast was a reading of 'A Terribly Strange Bed' in 1946 done for schools though the oldest broadcast which is extant in the BBC archives is the 1950 reading of 'Blow up with the Brig!' again done for schools. No other early radio broadcasts have been preserved until *The Moonstone* of 14 October 1979 – from which date everything seems to be extant.

There is little chance of the BBC re-issuing these earlier works. Until fairly recently actors and writers retained copyright in repeats or reuse of material. So finding all those involved – or their estates – and buying them out would be too expensive.

The list below shows the fairly limited group of works from which radio programmes were made. Only eight out of more than 20 novels are represented and a mere 13 out of more than 50 short stories have been used – and most of those were from the 1887 collection *Little Novels*. On television the selection is even smaller. Only *The Moonstone* and *The Woman in White* have been dramatised, three times each.

Collins appears as a character three of times on radio. Once in Michael Bakewell's *Life of Dickens* in 1988, again in Martyn Wade's 1998 comedy *The Man in White* and in 2004 in an adaptation of Dickens's *The Bride's Chamber*.

Biography has been patchy. Frederick Bradnum's radio portrait of Wilkie in 1868 was broadcast in 1971. And Richard Francis walked in his footsteps in 2002. Television has been worse. Gryff Rhys Jones visited Victorian London in search of Wilkie in 1996 and he was included in Reyer Banham's look at changing London in 1964. The pianist John Ogdon chose *The Moonstone* for his book on *Desert Island Discs* in 1989 and in 1997 Wilkie was Fiona Richmond's specialist subject in *Mastermind* – Andrew Gasson set the questions. In 2004 *The Woman in White* failed to win the 'Booker prize' for 1860. *Great Expectations* won.

A few items remain elusive. I have not been able to find a radio serial of *Armadale* or *The Moonstone* said to have been broadcast in the 1940s.

If anyone has details of any items not on the list – or of course has recordings of lost productions – please let me know. I will be expanding this archive to include non-BBC broadcasts.
